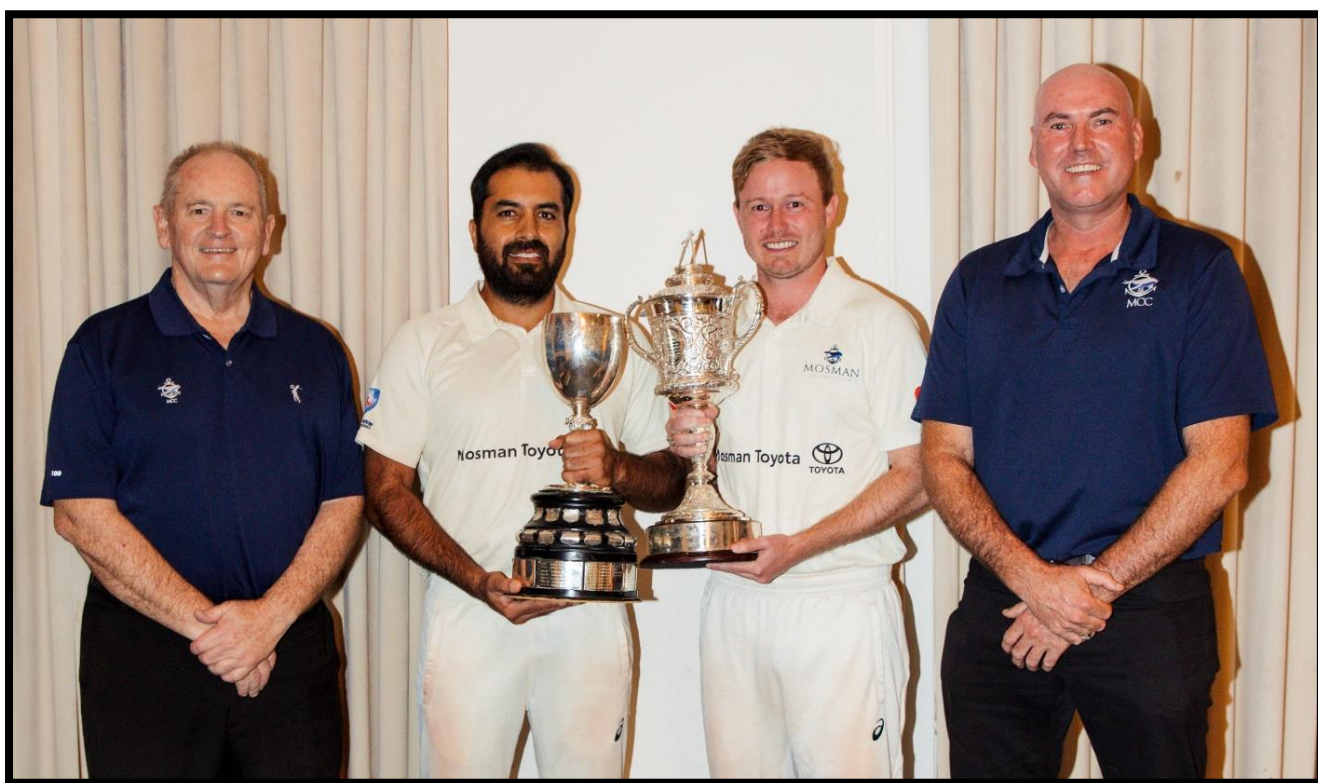

Vale: Peter Hector



Peter was born and raised in Bathurst before coming to Sydney in 1959 to study at Uni and then lived permanently in Sydney thereafter playing cricket for Mosman. Before his move to Sydney, he was captain of his Bathurst Scots school 1st XI. He was proud to keep a little newspaper clipping in his wallet for most of his life that highlighted him once taking 10 wickets in an innings I think in later school years.

Peter was an opening in-swing bowler, starting his career in PGs and playing mainly 2nd and 3rd grade although he played 7 matches in the firsts, cap no. 215. Overall, he took 246 wickets at 18.3 with half of those in seconds at 20.5.

His batting only produced 13 runs per innings, but he could belt the cover off the ball when in the mood and even had a half century to his name in 3rds.

He loved ball sports and excelled at a few. He was a state squash player, A-grade tennis player but cricket was his favourite sport. He also played golf Moreso in his retirement years as a member of Cromer golf club, winning several trophies there.

Peter's cricket genes have continued to his granddaughters Chloe and Elise who both play cricket with Mosman with their father Mark team manager. All are seen often at the Balmoral nets honing their skills. With this lineage, maybe we'll see another Hector play for the club in years to come.

Peter is survived by wife Jenny, daughter Nicole, Mark and five grandchildren.

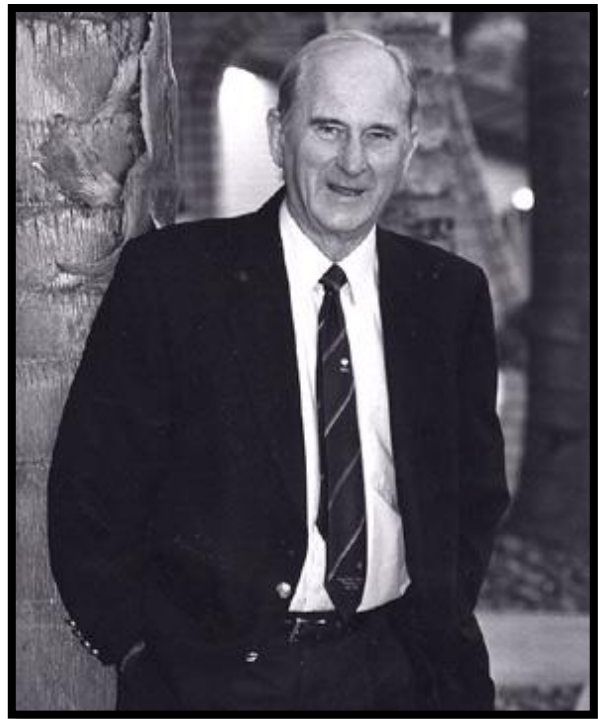
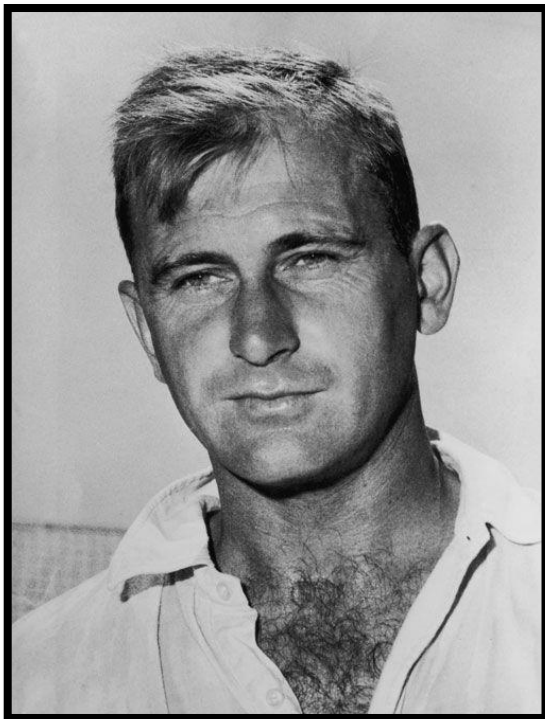

Peter played all his club cricket with Manly, but became our club coach in 1997 until 2005, and because of this duality we now play for the Peter Philpott cup when the two clubs meet.

Now let's go back to the early days when I first knew Peter. We both went to North Sydney Boys High School although I was two years ahead of him (born Jan. '33 – Oct. '34). I remember him at school being a prodigious leg spinner and although his record will show he was a competent batsman, this mantle was left with Ian Craig, also Peter's age. His cricket ability developed at an early age, spending 5 years in Green Shield and being picked in a combined side in all of those years. In his last year he went through the ranks of PG, 2nd grade and 1st grade taking 118 wickets for the season at 9.33.



Moving along, he played for the State and at age 30 for Australia against the West Indies and England, taking 28 wickets. His late entry to Tests was probably because of the other leg spinner, Richie Benaud. For NSW he took 245 wickets and scored 2889 runs, with two seasons as captain.

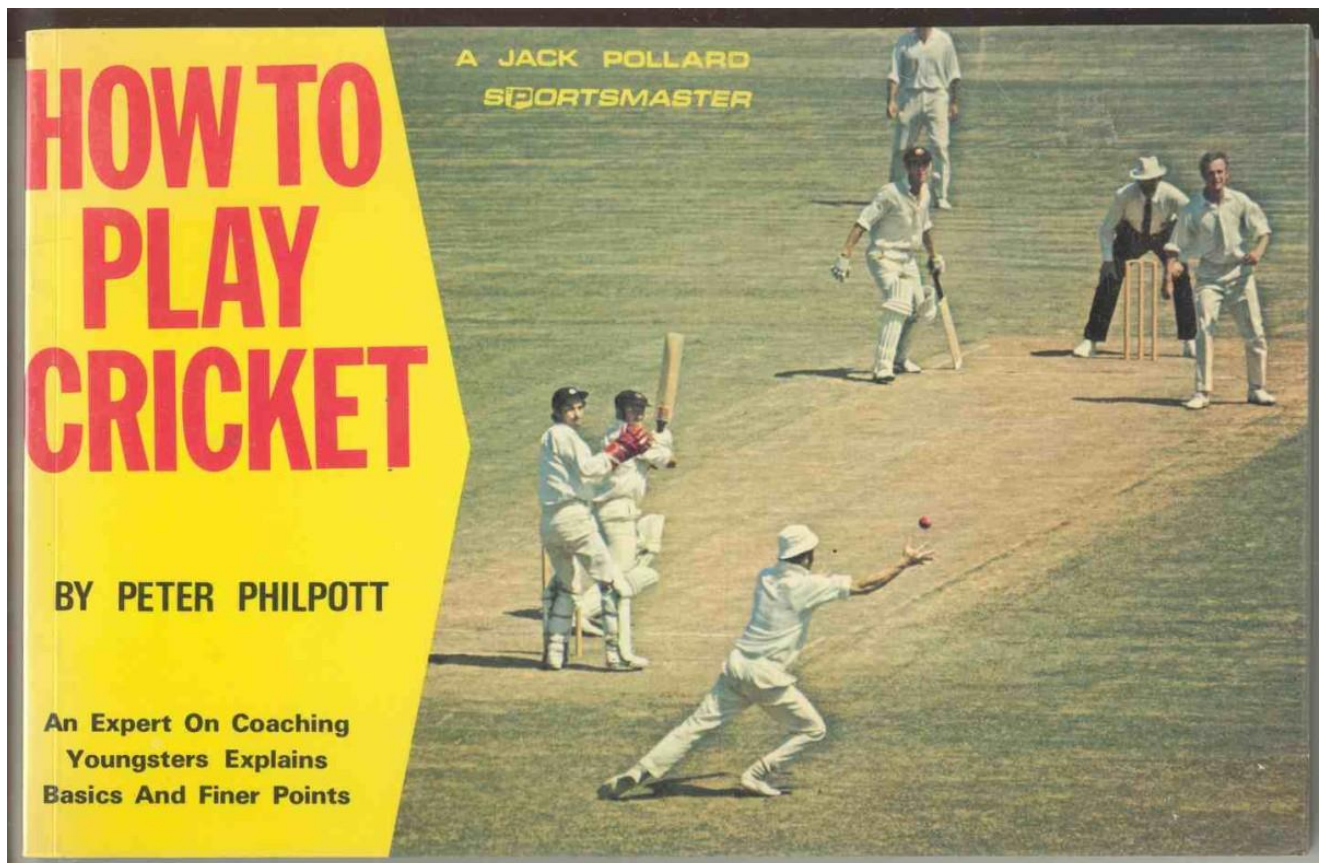
After retiring from top level cricket at 31 and club cricket a little later, he went on to coach NSW, South Australia, Yorkshire, Surrey and Sri Lanka, so he brought a lot of experience to Mosman.

These days well known cricketers make a good living from cricket, but back before 1980 it was necessary to have a job and so cricketers retired earlier. In Peter's case he was a school teacher at Kings and Shore. His knowledge of history was brought home to me in 2014 when I went on a cruise around Australia and Peter was on board to give daily lectures on early Australian history.

Peter wrote a few cricket books and in one he predicted he would live only to 70 because of an underlying heart condition that he'd had all his life. His prediction was wrong as he reached the devil's number of 87, retiring with his friends Alan Davidson and Ashley Mallet in the same week. I was privileged to be asked to attend his private funeral along with a handful of other cricketers.

A great bloke, a great cricketer and a dedicated one at that.

President's Report 2021-22

Amazing. Stunning. Outstanding.

There is no shortage of superlatives for Mosman's Season 21-22. For a season which threatened to start with a whimper back in September 2021, when the uncertainty about new waves of Covid and lockdowns was rife, by March it was finishing with a bang!

Collectively, the cricket community found a way to play in spite of the lack of clarity at the height of the Omicron Covid resurgence. Due in no small part to the commitment and drive of our amazing volunteer group – parents, friends and those who love the club – both Senior and Junior cricket started on time with a full season of play being scheduled, and we delivered a safe and rewarding experience for our players.

Little did we realise back in September that the season would end with the loudest bang, as we achieved the most successful summer in the club's 114-year history. Victory to both 1st and 2nd grade in NSW Premier Cricket. Second in the Club Championship. Our Metro Cup team were runners up again and I'm sure next season it will be our turn. Throw in our 5 grand final wins for our juniors made 2021-22 the best season ever. The happy details of these achievements will be set out in the following pages, but it would be remiss of me not to recognise both these wonderful achievements, and the people who had a big hand in making them possible.

Our First-Grade premiership was the first for Mosman since Stan McCabe held the Belvidere Cup above his head back in 1938-39, an 83-year drought finally broken which had felt at times like it may never end. Mosman had not held the Second-grade trophy aloft since 2006-07 when club stalwart Martin Haywood led the team to victory. We had never won both 1st and 2nd grade Premierships in the same season before. Indeed, this has only happened 10 times in more than 120 years of Sydney Grade Cricket and by only 5 clubs. St George have managed the feat 4 times and Sydney Uni three times. That leaves Mosman, Easts and North Sydney as the only clubs to have achieved the double.



Both grand final matches were genuine cliff hangers which tested the mettle of our players (and spectators!), and in the end they survived the toughest examination and came through victorious. The players, under the leadership of 1st grade captain Nathan Hinton, and 2nd grade captain Aadil Khalil can rightly claim these honours as they were both the best teams in their competitions. The ability of both sides to turn the tide in games throughout the season – to win matches that in past seasons we would have lost was a testament to players and coaches alike and was the difference in reaching the finals.

Behind the scenes, the work of several people was significant in making both the senior and junior success possible. Warwick Adlam, who wears more hats for the club than anyone else, worked tirelessly to make cricket possible every weekend for players from first grade through to our youngest Woolworths Blasters. Without his efforts the club would be in a poorer state. Peter Forrest and his group of assistant coaches created an environment which allowed each player to flourish and reach their potential. Their fresh, contemporary approach to training and player development resonated well with players of all ages.

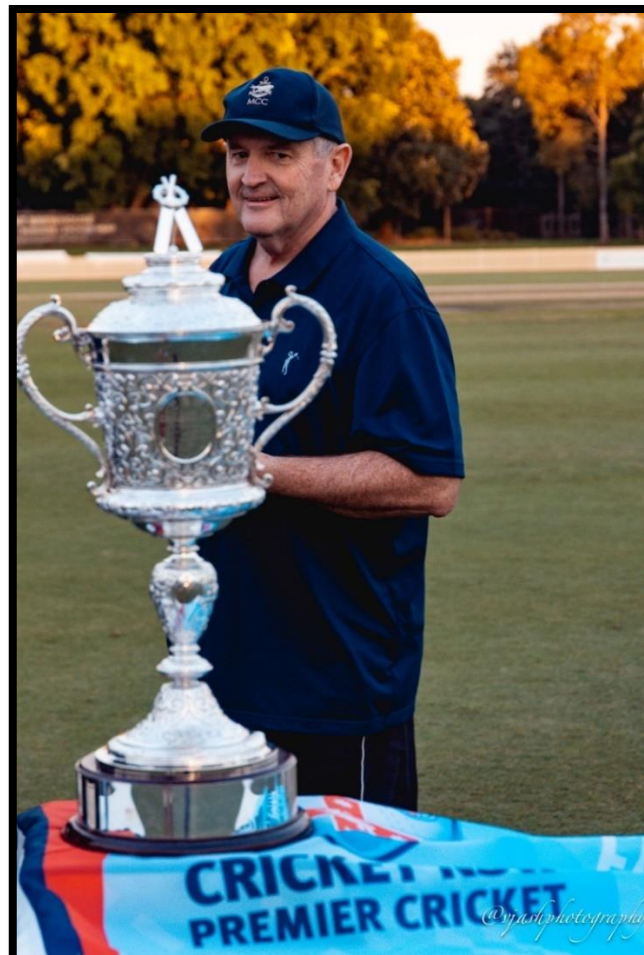
On top of the success of our junior sides in the North Shore competition, the number of Mosman boys and girls who were members of various representative teams far outweighed the size of our club. With so many talented cricketers coming through the ranks, the future is looking bright!

We are fortunate to have great support for our efforts from Mosman Council - councillors and staff alike. Council's commitment to rebuilding the pavilion at Allan Border Oval will create an outstanding community asset which will enhance the amenity of the area enormously. We will see the completion of this project during the coming summer. Investment in drainage and turf upgrades at Mosman ovals has paid dividends with Allan Border becoming one of the highest rated venues in Sydney, and Rawson Oval showing great improvements after major work was done in October and November. This coming season, similar drainage work will occur at Balmoral Oval. The surface there has been poor for some time so whilst it will mean a couple of months without this ground, the long-term payback will be worthwhile.

Our sponsors continue to provide essential support to make all this possible. We are fortunate to have a group of local businesses who have been associated with the club for several years. We value their continued loyalty and support and ask that you support these organisations when you are in the market.

On behalf of the committee, we thank every volunteer who has given up their time to help make Mosman Cricket Club what it is today. We have enjoyed great success this season, but rest assured we will not be sitting still – we have plans in place to take the club further forward so that last year’s results are not a once off, and with the continued support of the Mosman community our club will remain as the summer sport of choice for hundreds of Mosman locals, and we will continue to make Mosman proud of our efforts.

Treasurer's Report year ended 30 April 2022

On behalf of the Management Committee of the Mosman Cricket Club ("Club"), I am pleased to report on the financial performance of the Club for the financial year from 1 May 2021 to 30 April 2022 and the financial position of the Club as at 30 April 2022.

The Club reported a deficit for the year of \$20,184 (2021 \$27,932 surplus).

In a record-breaking year for the Club in terms of on-field performances, and difficult times arising from the uncertainties associated with the continuing Covid-19 pandemic and further uncertainties attributable to the prevailing La Nina weather pattern, and the disruption to infrastructure at AB Oval due to the rebuilding of the pavilion, the small deficit is considered to be a pleasing result.

Included in the above result is the amortisation of the cost of the capital works at the Balmoral nets and the Georges Heights wickets.

1st Grade Season Report 2021/22

Our bowlers, thanks to the efforts of our coaching staff of Peter Forrest and bowling coach Chuck Matthews, were able to stay fit and shared wickets around whilst bowling tight. There were a number of excellent individual performances from the bowling unit over the season but the way they bowled as a group again and again was a major reason we had such a successful season.

Through the season we got to again enjoy some individual success and representation at higher honours as well as hand out a number of first grade caps. Lachlan Hearne played his first one day match for NSW and again was able to play some more Sheffield shield matches. Jordan Cox was picked out of the blue to play for the Hobart Hurricanes. First grade caps were awarded to Stirling McAvoy, Jordan Cox, Tom Colgan, Max Papworth, Liam O'Farrell and Guy Hammond. Coach Peter Forrest was also awarded coach of the year at the SCA award nights.

The finals series was intense, stressful and extremely enjoyable. There were some unbelievable individual performances throughout the finals, some of which will never be forgotten. We were able to get a fighting draw in the quarter final. Peter Forrest played an innings that will go down in history for the club scoring a match defying 121* and with some excellent support from Matt Calder, Dean Crawford and Jayden Park we were able to bat enough time and put enough on the board to make it too tough a task for a fast-finishing St George side with Jake Turner being the pick of the bowlers with 4/80. Randwick were next in a semi where weather again was impacting the game. Our batsman were able to bat enough time to get through to the rain which would see us qualify for the big dance. Runs were shared around the order however special mention to Matt Calder and Dean Crawford who again made some vital contributions to the total and put us in an excellent position.

The grand final was intense, being sent in on an overcast day we were behind the game early with Northern District taking some early wickets. A freakish run out saw Peter Forrest run out and saw us sitting very nervously wondering what score could we post to give ourself a chance. Lachlan Hearne then played the innings of his young career scoring 144 of our 300 to give us something to bowl at. He was supported by Dean Crawford, who again, was able to score some vital runs at an important time. Our time in the field could not have started better with a wicket on the last ball of the first over getting the mood and the energy right up at lunch on day 2. The rest of the innings was not as simple, it was a tough toil on a slow dead wicket against some quality batting. We chipped away trying our best to stay patient and stick to our plans to find a way through the ND batting line up. Some mammoth efforts with the ball saw Jayden Park bowl over 50 overs with no skin left on his spinning finger, Eli Eales bowling a career high 34 overs and Jake Turner somehow getting through 42 overs. The man

of the day and awarded man of the match was Jake Turner who took his first ever 5 fa for Mosman in an inspirational effort of grit and skill. The game going down to the last handful of overs and last half hour of play was extremely nerve racking however the way we won the game not one person would change.

It was easily the best feeling I have ever had on a sporting field, and I think that would be the same for all of the team. The droves of Mosman supporters flooding the fields to celebrate the win was a special moment and the days/weeks of celebration after shows how much it meant for everyone involved.

A massive thank you needs to go out to the committee and the club in general for being able to provide the support, resources, staff and man hours that all contributed to success we were able to enjoy! Belvidere winners after such a long time and the whole playing group is grateful to be a part of drought breaking history!!

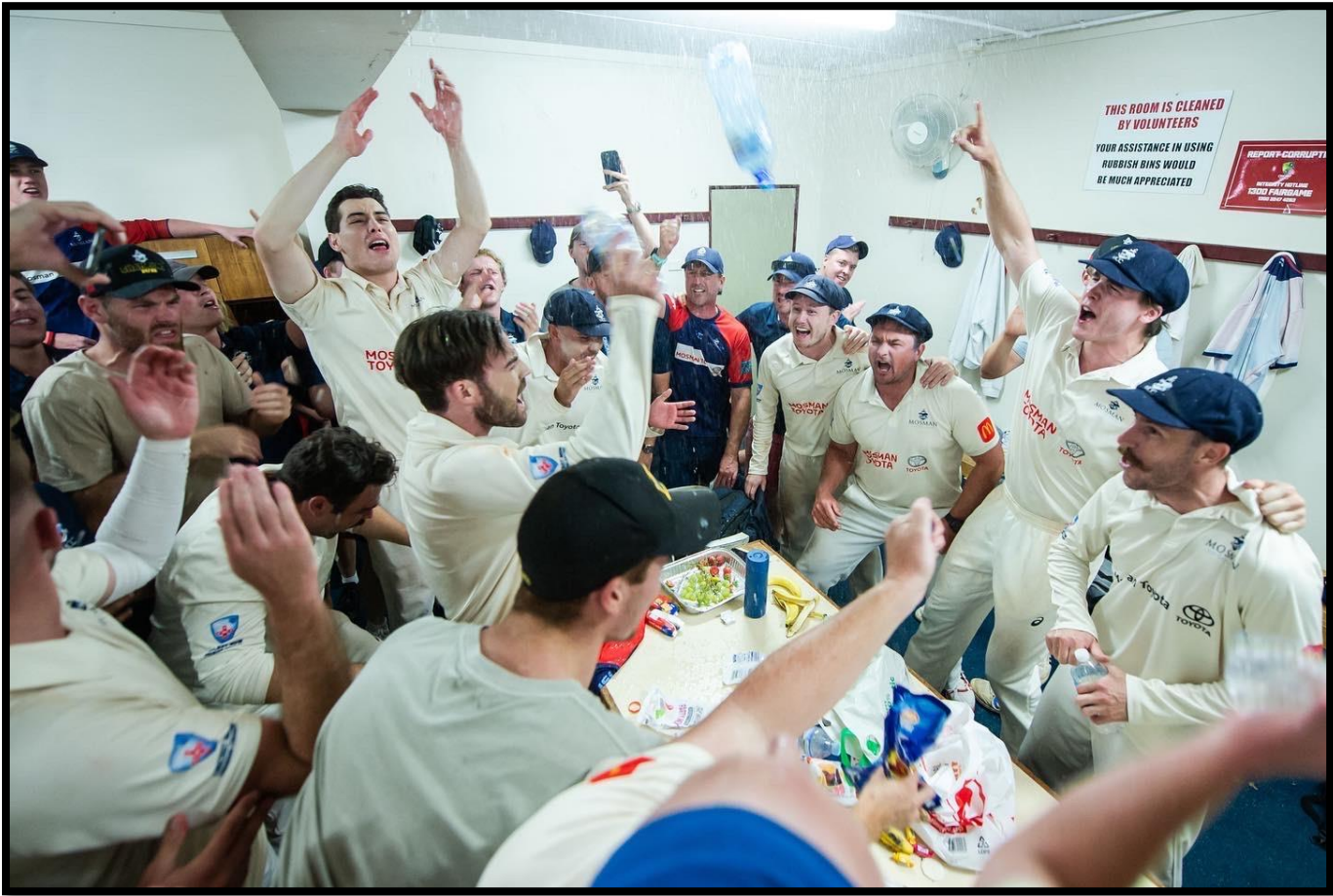

4th Grade Season Report 2021/22

A roller coaster season for 4s with some ordinary cricket played early on followed by some excellent wins against some top sides towards the end of the season. The loss was tough but it did show some good fight in the boys. By round 10 our season was almost over as we had only notched up 2 wins and we were facing a very strong Sydney Uni outfit who were well above us on the ladder. This would be our best win of the season where we chased down 190 for the loss of just four wickets. Mitch Roeder (63) and Flynn Zwinkels (46) putting on a century opening stand. This gave us some confidence going into latter half of the season and we then won the next three games giving us some hope for the finals. We smashed Bankstown in round 11 by 96 runs where we saw Josh Brownie come into his own taking 3/15 off 9 overs. Nihir has played plenty of 2nd grade before and it showed as he mesmerized the Penrith batsmen taking 6/21 off 10 overs. He was a class above and it was great to watch.

So, with four rounds to go we were only six points out of the top 6 and were simply flying with four wins on the trot. Wests next where we came unstuck on a tricky Rawson wicket. We only managed 112 with Wests passing us 6 down. The final three rounds were washed out so that was season over. It was a shame as the feeling in the group for those four wins in a row was simply unreal. The poor start to the season just put us too far behind the leaders.

In summary our batting let us down way too often. Not once did we post a score over 200, had no centurions and only passed 50 on three occasions in the whole season. Of the twelve games we played, eight of those we scored less than 150 which makes it nearly impossible to get consistent wins going. So that is the challenge for next season. We need more half centuries and would be nice to see some three- figure innings.

A huge congratulations to 1st and 2nd grades and to see us finish 2nd in Club Champs. The vibe at the club was unreal and you could see the excitement grow as 1s and 2s moved towards creating history. Massive thanks to Foz for taking charge again and to the whole club for making everyone feel welcome. To our inspirational net Captain Painey who is always looking out for us and to Wick who just does everything for us.

6th Grade Season Report 2021/22

Sixth grade's 2021/22 season was one of multiple wins, washouts, socially distanced high-fives and yet another grand final. But as is often the case in Metro Cup, it started with panicked phone calls on a November Friday evening in a bid to field eleven fit bodies. There were the usual faces in the likes of Corey Calvert, Nick Slack, Oliver Chandler-Evans and Ben James but also fresh blood with Kaylin Dauji and Vaibhav Manikandan.

In perhaps a sign of things to come on that first game week, veteran Chris Brown twisted his knee in the very first over. His season was done before it had started.

With the Whales still waiting for the arrival of the ever-late Uzair Siddiqui, they were all of a sudden down to nine men. Enter Oliver Chandler-Evan's dad as substitute fielder. With cream slacks, runners and a Mosman top at least two sizes too small, it was peak Metro Cup in what was the very first round. What followed in the next few hours was nothing short of a flogging. Sydney Uni plundered 317 runs off their 50 overs with the Whales managing just 121 in reply. It would have been enough to knock the confidence of most sides and set them on a slippery slope for the season. To the boy's credit, they dusted themselves off and put it behind them straight away.

Round two we headed to Penrith. It was a low scoring affair with special mention to Gus Tesoriero and Alex Lee-Young who both exhibited the skills and maturity of men twice their age. The Whales managed just 122 but newcomer Manikandan tied them down with his tricky off-spin, finishing with figures of 4 for 9 off his five overs.

It was Calvert though who claimed the final wicket with Penrith just two runs short. Having adjusted his pace, the batsmen mistimed, looping up a catch to Vijay Dharman.

Pandemonium ensued and social distancing requirements well and truly went out the window.

The Whales were now on a roll, beating Hawkesbury the following weekend out at Bensons thanks to another fine day out for Manikandan (3/15 off 7) and Kaylan Daji (3/22 off 7). Lowly placed Gordon likely avoided a spanking the following round after an early call to abandon after failing to put the covers down.

The final round before Christmas saw the Whales back at Balmoral for the first time against the hotly-tipped other Sydney Uni side. Captain Ben James was ruled out with a late Covid scare, leaving the ever-dependable Mackenzie Green to rally the troops.

And rally them he did, leading the Whales to an emphatic win. Batting first, Evan Poon (31), Chandler-Evans (56) and Fergus Hitchin (48*) were all in the runs. The bowlers then did the business with Alex Ferretti (1/12 off 4), Zaeem Tapia (1/7 off 7) keeping things tight up top. Cam Frost (2/26 off 6) gave an indication of what he'd produce later in the season before part-time seamer Calvert from nowhere took 5/19 off 8 to help bowl out the students for just 90.

Over Christmas Metro did a bit too much mingling, leaving several players Covid positive for the rescheduled fixture against Warringah at Rawson Oval. Tapia (2/17 off 8) and youngster Ferretti (2/21 off 7) were ever dependable opening the bowling before Manikandan ripped into them with 4/28. The Whales then passed the 152 target with five wickets down.

A rare off day followed against UNSW with a heavy defeat before back-to-back wins against the two North West outfits. By this point in the season, the Whales had established the deadliest bowling attack in the cup. Ferretti and Tapia were on the money from the off, moving the new ball both ways before the Whale's array of spinners in Frost, Manikandan, Daji, Liam Kinna and James Nemeč did the bulk of the damage. With James and Calvert also available to call upon there were very few sides making it through the full 50.

Round 12 saw the Whales inflict defeat on Randwick Petersham Gold due in no small part to an entertaining 75 from Nemec.

What followed in round 13 was a narrow defeat (9/204 chasing 7/209) out at a sweltering Kanebridge Oval. Despite the loss it was a coming-of-age knock from Elliot Evans who hit a sublime 82* as he attempted to chase down the target with the help of James (17) - the pair putting together a record eighth wicket partnership for Mosman Metro in the process.

With three rounds to go a place in finals was secure. It was now just a case of how high up the table the Whales could finish. Light work was made of Georges River thanks largely to an inspired spell of bowling from Ryan Drake who took four wickets from four maiden overs. If it wasn't for his dodgy back, the opposition may have struggled to reach double figures. Frost continued to cause issues with another 2-fer while Ben McNeil had the ball on a string, recording figures of 3/12 off 7.

It was a special day all round for the McNeil household with dad Ben and son Henry batting together reaching 54 and 25 respectively.

Then came the near Biblical levels of rain, washing out the last two rounds of the season to leave Mosman second on the ladder. That set up a quarter final against Hawkesbury out at Rawson Oval. Evans continued his hot run of form with an excellent 59, assisted by Evan Poon with 24 as the Whales put 159 on the board.

A tremendous all-round bowling display saw the Hawkes restricted to 136 with Frost (3/28), Manikandan (2/23) and Ferretti (2/16) showing themselves to be among the best in the competition.

The semi-final saw the Whales take on minor premiers Sydney University Gold at St Pauls. Having battered them in the round before Christmas, confidence was high. But an unseasonable amount of rain, coupled with some questionable ground maintenance meant not a ball was bowled in anger and the Whales progressed to their second grand final in as many years.

Their foes would be Warringah with Manly's Graham Reserve the final away day of the season. Just days out, word came through that star bowler Ferretti had broken his arm while playing football at school. Tapia stepped up, fresh (or perhaps not so fresh) from his honeymoon. Mosman bowled first, restricting Warringah to a chaseable 167 with a pair of wickets each for Manikandan, Frost and Nemec. Calvert got off to a flyer in reply, hitting 40 in quick time before being caught. But nobody could quite match Calvert's fluency, with the next top scorers Evans (17) and Manikandan (16). In the end the Whales fell just 21 runs short and Warringah took the cup.

Roll on the 2022/23 season when Metro will be back, looking to take that one step further.

With a small target in sight, the whales went out swinging but were in a bit of trouble at 3/16. However, a good partnership from Jordan Cox (21*) and Hugo Farquharson (66*), allowed the whales to hit the sheds early and sing the song.

The final round game of the season was at AB versus Manly. The whales elected to bat first, with a strong opening partnership between McAvoy (59) and Hearne which got the boys off to a flyer. However, tight Manly bowling and consecutive wickets with no partnerships, proved difficult for Mosman to find momentum. Mosman was restricted to 138, which was under par on a flat AB wicket. Manly ultimately chased the total 2 down and won easily.

Mosman finished the season with 3 wins, 1 loss and 1 draw from the 5 round games. However, Mosman just finished out of the top 4 due to the complexities of net run rate, meaning they did not progress to finals. Ultimately, it was a great season from the Whales with everyone supporting one another and enjoying the sport we all love.

Season Report 2021 - 22

It's hard to put into words the roller coaster ride our Green Shield boys had this season. Three clinical convincing wins, 3 heart-breaking losses and a washout which resulted in a protest lodged with the SCA. As a result, we missed out on making the finals despite playing some quality cricket in each game. We had a good mix of player ages with five U16 boys, nine U15 and one U14 youngster in Jacob Callaway. The pre- season went well, and we were primed for round 1 against local rivals Manly at AB. This would be the first of three nail biting finishes for all players and spectators. We only managed 138 on a good deck with Kel Wilson 32 top scoring. We needed to bowl and field the house down against a very strong Manly batting line-up. We did just that with Will Nutt leading the way. Nutty was fast and intimidating and he would continue this through our campaign. He picked up 3 for not many, Sam Scott bowled a superb spell in the middle taking 3/23 from his 10, we took all our catches and suddenly we had Manly 9/136 just 3 runs shy of the target. For the next two overs we would see several play and misses which had the players and crowd at wits end before a thick edge over gully got Manly home. A tough loss first up but it showed a never say die attitude in this group of players.

Round 2 we headed to Blacktown where we posted a score of 189. This was probably 30 odd under par given to excellent batting deck. Kel Wilson again top scored, this time with 79 and Will Adlam 35. We had to hit the field full of confidence and we did that. Kept it tight early before Sam Scott ripped through the middle order. Scotty picked up 4/30 off his 10, a couple of run outs followed and we had them 9/121, still 68 runs behind with number 9 and 11 at the crease. Game over you would think. Cricket can be brutal, and brutal it was for the next 15 overs. Their number 9 just started swinging, plenty of play and misses but then he started connecting. A few fours were hit and then some started clearing the fence. No one thought it could continue without putting up a catch somewhere. He didn't and they got the runs with 2 overs to go. This was an extremely tough loss to swallow as we had them on toast. Everyone was in shock, and it was a tough drive home for all.

Round 3 against Randwick we needed to win or season pretty much over and win we did. Randwick batted well making 6/211 with Josh Malone picking up 3. We came out positive and chased that down easily for the loss of only 2 wickets with six overs to spare. Axel Bailey opened up scoring a solid 55. Will Adlam at his best finishing with 85no and Alex Lee-Young 42no. It was a quality partnership between these two of just under 100. A much nicer car trip back home over the bridge.

Round 4 back to AB against Bankstown who are always a tough outfit. They won the toss and had no hesitation batting first without knowing the barrage they were about to encounter. The deck was hard with a nice grass covering. Nutty started it bowling quick and short with the batsmen ducking for cover. It was great viewing, we quickly put in a short leg and the wickets started to fall. The Bankstown boys were intimidated and didn't know what to do. Jonty Snyman came on 1st change and was even more lethal than Nutty picking up wickets at will. Nutty finished with 3 for 22 and Jonty 4 for 24. Bankstown all out for 91 in just 23 overs. It was the most intimidating Green Shield bowling seen for years by a Mosman outfit. Kel Wilson and Axel Bailey came out firing with the bat, Bankstown tried the same tactics but didn't have the pace. We got the runs none down in just the 17th over with Kel 63no and Axe 25no. A dominating win with a bonus point which put our season back on track as we headed into the Christmas break.

Round 5 against Hawkesbury was a crucial game and everyone knew it. Winning the toss, we batted first but again didn't capitalise on some good starts only getting to 7/169 off our 50 overs. Alex Lee-Young posted his first half century scoring 52 and Austen Hiskens 30. The Hawks did bowl well, but we were probably 40 odd short. Josh Malone this time starred with the ball putting us in the box seat. Josh picked up 4/22 off his 10 in his best bowling performance of the season. We picked up 2 run outs and had them 9/152. 17 still needed with numbers 10 and 11 at the crease. Not again, it was too much for some as Hawkesbury slowly edged closer to the target. Again, no chances were given, we bowled well but for the third time in five games we saw the opposition get the runs 9 down and go crazy storming the field.

Round 6 v Wests would be the most frustrating day of the season. Bowling first we had Wests on the ropes with two early run outs. Nutty picked up a wicket then two more run outs, we were simply on fire in the field. At the 40 over mark the heavens opened with Wests 7/139.



After several hours the covers came off, but we noticed they hadn't covered the whole square leaving one wicket on the far side uncovered. Because of this we didn't get back on with play being called off just after 6pm. As it turned out the Wests covers weren't big enough to cover the entire square which provided grounds for a protest. Without going into detail, the protest was knocked back and the result remained a draw.

Our protest against Wests hadn't been determined by the SCA when we fronted up for our final round against a red-hot Sydney outfit. They were one of the favourites and a win against us would put them in the top 4. We won the toss and decided to bowl first on a good deck just to mix things up. It may have also been to simply avoid the chance of a nail-biting finish again. Josh Malone was superb bowling 9 overs for just 16 runs taking 1 wicket. Will Nutt was in the wickets again picking up 3 for 29. Tom Molloy was again economical taking 2 for 26 off his 10. It was a great team bowling performance against one of the top batting sides in the competition. Sydney all out for 167 after 48 overs. The run chase was great theatre with both teams on top at certain stages. Kel Wilson 44 looked a class above as he had done all season. A couple of quick wickets fell though and we found ourselves 5/93 with Sydney well on top. Sam Wright however played his best innings of the season going on the attack from ball one scoring 31 off just 20 balls. His innings changed the game and gave us back the momentum. Will Allen remained calm finishing on 34no which got us to the target 6 down with 10 overs to spare. Another extremely convincing win against one of the top teams.

A few days later we received the SCA determination re the Wests protest, we weren't successful and the result would remain a draw. That meant season over for us which was hard to take considering we could have easily finished 2nd on the table if a couple of play and misses in those three tight losses was nicked.

There were plenty of highlights across the 7 games. Will Nutt was the third highest wicket taker in the competition and so was named in the SCA Green Shield merit XI. Kel Wilson showed what a class act he is with the bat. Not once did he look troubled at the crease by the opposing bowlers. Josh Malone was a very welcome addition to the squad as was Will Allen following both coming to us from the Inner West. With 10 players backing up it's looking good for season 2022/23.

Special thanks to Ade Molloy for his role as Manager, the parents were unbelievable especially the lunches they put on for everyone. I've never seen so much excitement at lunch time. Bring on next season.

Mosman coaches report 2021/22

The preseason started with travel restrictions and lockdowns due to the covid 19 which affected and delayed the seasons start. Social distancing and training in no more than groups of 10 became the norm for most of preseason. The season was delayed a few weeks with a change in format implemented to reduce the effect of covid restrictions. For grades 2-6, one day cricket was the only format played and first grade played only 1 two-day game before finals with all other rounds being one-day cricket. The change to one day cricket appeared to suite the Whales with the club having its most successful season ever!

For the first time in 83 years first grade won the Belvidere Cup after a nearly flawless season. The team dominated most oppositions all year regularly taking bonus points off quality teams in a real coming of age season for the whales. The pace bowling group which was led by Jake Turner and featured Elijah Eales, Dean Crawford, Matt Moran. Jayden Park squeezed the life out of opposition teams batting line ups and allowed the batting group to play with complete freedom. Jayden's figures in the Grand final (2 for 58 off 51 overs) were simply unbelievable and showed how important he was all season. The batting group played a fearless brand of cricket all year with different people standing up each week to shoulder the responsibility. Peter Forrest and Lachlan Hearne led the batting efforts with excellent contributions from Harry Dalton and match winning rear-guard action from Dean Crawford at important times during the year and especially in the final's series.

The side went agonizingly close to contesting the Sixers conference T20 final going down in a narrow loss to UNSW in the semi-final at AB with Uni needing 6 to win off the last ball and getting it done! A season that no doubt will be spoken about for a long time to come and a great reward for all the boys' efforts during the year. I doubt anyone will forget that final over which included Jake Turner taking a hat-trick then a final ball loss.

In another unbelievable season for the club our second-grade team led by Aadil Khalil also dominated the whole season from start to finish. To finish Minor Premiers and 19 pints clear of 2nd place is just extraordinary. Harjit Singh was the standout performer all year with 45 wickets at 14.44. Our second-grade team was a real mix of youth and experience with Matt Junk, Aadil Khalil, and Ash Doolan leading the charge for the experienced guys. The young batting group lead by Tom and Joe Colgan did the heavy scoring with both players having break out seasons. Liam O'Farrell had an amazing debut season for us scoring heavily (648 runs) and making his 1st grade debut. Liam and Max Papworth got the team off to great starts most of the year and allowed the young blokes to come in and finish the job. To have three batsmen force the selectors hand in picking them in the top grade is just what we want. Tom Colgan, Max Papworth and Liam O'Farrell all worthy 1st grade debutants and will play a lot of 1st grade in future years. The teams amazing efforts were rightly rewarded with the Premiership after hosting the final at a packed Allan Border oval, winning the match in a close contest against Sutherland. Unfortunately, I had business to attend to at Bankstown oval so wasn't there to witness the win or celebrate it but I've only heard it was a cracker of a night. A wonderful season for 2s and one that the players should be very proud of.

Our third-grade side lead by Dan Apps just missed out on the finals by quotient (.08) with rain hampering their efforts late in the season. For the first time in a long time, we had some experience through our third-grade team with George Condon, Dylan Mares and John Venianakis all contributing during the season. The wickets were shared around with Dylan Mares finishing on top with exciting

young quick Zak Hall up the top of the wicket taker lists. The team will be better poised to contest the finals next year after coming so close this year.

Our fourth-grade team was a very young side lead by Lachy Donaldson. The team was affected greatly by player movement up and down the grades with 32 players used during the year. The side finished 10th and was in the hunt for finals late in the season but again their run for the finals was hampered by late season rain limiting the opportunity for much needed points. The side will be better off for the experience and we are looking forward to some strong performances from the young group moving forward.

Our Fifth-grade team struggled all year with such a young group who no doubt learnt a lot about playing grade cricket. They lost their skipper mid-season and thankfully Raman stepped in doing a great job. They finished 18th, not able to gain any momentum during the year. We are looking forward to their improved performances after getting a taste of grade cricket this year.

The mighty sixth grade (metropolitan cup) team had another great season playing in their second **grand final in 2 years and 3 third finals series in a row**. The side was led by Ben James and featured a young team full of talent for the club moving forward. The side changed regularly with player availability affecting the team both up and down during the year. They used 31 players with all contributing to the success of the team at various stages. Unfortunately, they couldn't quite get the job done against a strong Warringah team in the grand final but none the less another excellent season from our Metro boys. A great reward for their work at training during the year and we are looking forward to their continued success for seasons to come.

All in all, a wonderful season for the club finishing second in the club championships and bringing home the top 2 trophies. On behalf of the coaches, we would like to thank the players for their continued buy in during a challenging but successful year. Training attendances were high all year and we reaped the rewards at the end of the year. The coaches are excited about the drive we see in the club and the ambition from our players to achieve some great things. We look forward to a really successful period for the mighty Whales moving forward.

Thanks to our inspirational net Captain Painey. A thankless task mate but so much appreciated by all. The water, lollies and constant hand sanitizer shows how much you love Mosman Cricket Club. Lock yourself in for the job next season.

Finally, to the Committee led by Bernie and Wick. In the two years I've been here the support from the Committee has been sensational and I can't thank them enough for that. Bernie just gets the job done and Wick does all he can to make the club better. 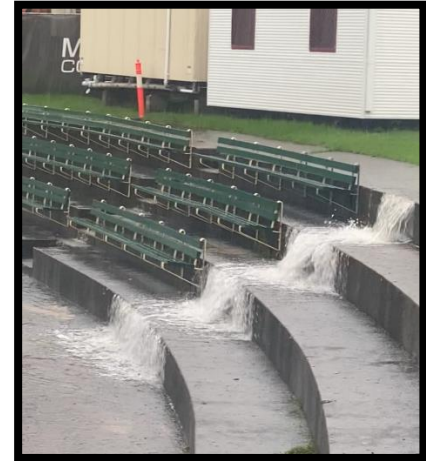

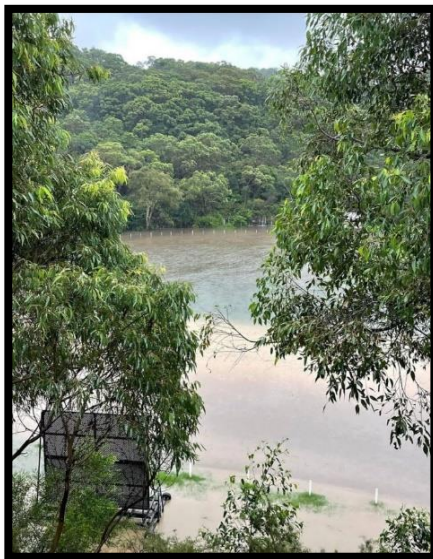

Our 2021/22 team of the year was completely dominated by 1st and 2nd grade players after a record-breaking season by both teams. Vaibhav Manikandan being the only player not from the top two grades to make the cut.

NO LONGER THE BRIDESMAID

As the oldest club member still active, now as a spectator, I have been around for over 75 years of our first-grade history of 101 seasons. Of course, we had 13 years of sub-district cricket (2nd and 3rd grades) before that until we were given full status.

When we entered the first-grade era in 1921/22 we came second; not a bad start, and since then we won four premierships in the 1930s before finals were introduced. i.e., first past the post. Then, minor premiers twice and beaten in the finals followed by three other finals but not succeeding to annex the Cup. As recompense we won the Limited Overs 50 final in 2008/9.

So how was the vibe as we commenced 2021/22 with basically the same players as the previous year when we came 14th. There is a proverb that says “bowlers win matches” and to some extent this may be the reason for this year’s success. Although Jake Turner and Elijah played a few games last season they both suffered with injury problems, but this year playing nearly all games they combined to take 33 wickets each. And Matt Moran and Dean Crawford should not be overlooked with 30 and 29 respectively.

Come the big day. Northern District were minor premiers and had beaten us during the season, putting us into second place. We batted first with a rain delayed start but ending the day at 8/190. Not very promising but at least Lachie was still in and Craw knew how to hang around and hit the loose ball. The partnership flourished until Craw succumbed for 46 leaving Jake to hang in there with Lachie. Jake did this for a valuable 2, but was stranded there as Lachie was dismissed for 144. The score was exactly 300, but was it enough as ND had a strong batting lineup.

Day 2 ended with ND being 4/120, Jake having two of the wickets and adding another immediately the next day; 5/131 so game on. I will leave first grade temporarily because we mustn’t forget the seconds, who played yesterday.

Their 50 over final was against Sutherland and at the end of our allotted 50 overs the score was 9/217 – Ash Doolan 49 and Hugo Farquharson 45 – not a big total. Sutherland started reasonably, but at 2/115 they lost 3 for 3 to put us back in the game. Then a partnership of 76 put them back in contention, but they ran out of steam at 9/212. A win is a win, if only by 5 runs. Second grade can now boast of winning 6 premierships.

Back to Bankstown Oval where NDs is digging in. There doesn’t seem to be an effort to win, a draw will give them the premiership. As an example, Jayden Park bowled 51 overs for 58 runs and 2 wickets. After another 60 odd runs, another wicket, with runs coming slowly and a wicket here and there. With the score at 9/279 and about 5 overs to go till stumps, the in-form batsman tries to keep the strike and fails, so it’s all over. Premiers.

Now a quick look at the season. I divided my time between firsts and seconds as I couldn't be bothered running around Sydney anymore and so took up permanent residence at Allan Border Oval (nee Mosman Oval). The grandstand was down and huts were used for dressing sheds, scorers' accommodation and toilets, and as it was a very wet season the ground around these structures was mud. If I can call Ian Finlay an oldie, then he Bob Guthrie and I were the principal supporters, as well as players' relatives of course.

It's hard to make comparisons from one year to the next, but there were some very lopsided results in firsts, with many of our players not getting a bat in the days before Xmas. I well remember, not so many moons ago, some officials of newer clubs calling for our demise as the demographics of the population was moving westward and that some of the inner-city clubs were becoming redundant. So, season 2021/22 saw Campbelltown, Fairfield, Penrith, Blacktown and Hawkesbury, 5 of the newer clubs and all in the outer suburbs filling the last 5 places in the club championship and 4 of them also doing so in first grade. As a contrast, ND, Manly and us filled the top 3 spots in the club championship and in 2nd and 5th grades four of the top six were northsiders. How the worm turns!

Let's hope next season will not be a letdown and that we can be up there again. Finally, the person who took the most wickets and made the most runs for the season was Toni Lorraine.

Mosman Junior Cricket Club Season 2021/22

Season 2021-22 was again Covid 19 affected especially pre-season. No winter sports had taken place at all and no one knew when or if our season would kick off. The Balmoral nets were getting a good work out though as training in pairs was still permitted. This continued well into September with no start for the season confirmed until early October. The good news finally came through that the season would start on 30th October which was a month later than normal.

Organising teams was extremely rushed but when round one commenced, we had entered 34 teams into the NSJCA competition. A couple of rounds were added into January to make up for the late start and we ended up only playing one round less than normal. Once the first wicket was taken and boundary scored it was non-stop action with plenty of highlights. Our usual Friday night 20/20 competition proved very popular again with around 120 youngsters packing AB oval having a great time from 5pm -7pm. The bar and barby in full swing despite having no grandstand.

Woollies Blast started the weekend after with around 60 odd youngsters honing their skills at AB Oval. We ran several holiday camps over the summer, run by the men at Cricket Appeal. We would like to thank Ash Doolan and his coaches for providing our youngsters with top class coaching throughout the year.



The weather again caused havoc especially towards the end of the season. The rain just didn't stop for 2 weeks in late February with the final round and all semi-finals being washed out. Thankfully the sun came out for Grand Final weekend where we had 5 teams competing in Championship grand finals.

All 5 of those matches were victorious so we finished the season with 5 Championship Premierships, one less than last season. This now brings our tally to 28 Premierships in the last five seasons. To put that into perspective we have won a total of 73 flags since the Junior Club formed 75 years ago with 40% of our total Premierships won in the last 5 years. Our purple patch is certainly continuing

Grand Final matches can be roller coaster games but this season we won all but one pretty comfortably, with only the U13s going down to the wire. The U17s had a 34- run victory but it could have been a lot closer if not for Mosman's final batting over where we scored 27 runs. Jamison Veitch smacking four 6's which changed the game completely. We have now won the U17s trophy for the last four seasons.

Our U10 McCabe side went through the season undefeated and were our Mosman Toyota team of the year. They won most games with ease with the grand final summing up their season where they won by a convincing 65 runs. They certainly knew how to have fun both on and off the field.

Last year our U12s dominated the Premierships, this season our U13s took that title. Our U13 girls GF was over in the blink of an eye. They dismissed St Ives for just 20 and reached that target only losing 1 wicket. Our U13 Div 1 team had the closest game winning by just 11 runs where North Sydney needed 18 off the final over and only managed 7. The last victory of the weekend was our U13 T20 who chased down 119 for the loss of only 3 wickets with three overs to spare. Zale Mills was devastating with the bat smacking 30no from just 17 balls.

For several seasons now Mosman Juniors have dominated NSJCA rep teams, and this year was no different with 42 players gaining selection from U11s to U15s. This is double the number of the next closest club. The Rep season was hugely affected by Covid 19 where the late start forced games into February when it would normally be all over by mid-December.

Will Adlam won the Adam Gilchrist award again for best performed Rep player across all age groups. This is the first time a player has won the award back-to-back since its inception 13 years ago. The U14 age group took out the Harold Moore Shield with Jacob Callaway (Captain), Gus Tesoriero and Alex Ferretti flying the Mosman flag.

Jacob Callaway was the leading wicket taker in the CNSW Youth Championships U14s competition with 18 wickets @10.28. Will Adlam was the leading run scorer in the U15s competition scoring 570 runs @95.00.

Seven of our players received individual NSJCA batting or bowling awards. We had one club centurion in Xavier Keen (102no), four 5 wicket hauls and one hat-trick. Sam Hirst finished his Junior playing career as our most capped player ever reaching 149 games played. Cooper Johnston finished his career with 134. The question is, will Sam Hirst ever get caught?

Austen Sharp was a worthy Hammy Love Memorial Shield winner. Austen has been an integral part of the Junior committee for several years and headed up our coaching programme. Austen first came to the club in 2014/15 where he coached his sons U10 team and remained their coach for the next eight season finishing up this year as U17 Premiers. Austen will be sorely missed as he now moves onto the senior club.

Mosman McCabe U17s Premiers report

The 21/22 season continued where the 20/21 season left off with the weather (rain) and the global pandemic doing their best to disrupt proceedings. In all, 3 games were abandoned and a further 2 games would have been abandoned had the McCabe team (and some parents) not rallied and cleared the ovals of water the day before.

The Mosman McCabe 17s player group was large, and we had decided to enter just one team into the competition, so we could manage the COVID risk and player unavailability and still field a full team on game day. The group comprised a good mix of older and younger aged boys, many of whom knew each other and had played together before.

The group trained together each week along with the boys from the T20 U16s team. It was a pleasure to coach this group and to witness their growth over the season. Their achievements were a result of their teamwork, their attitude and their commitment to bringing the best version of themselves on game day. No better example of this was our Round 11 top of the ladder clash versus North Sydney Thomas, at Tunk's Park.

Winning the toss and electing to bat, we recovered from 3-19 and posted a competitive score of 7-143. We then set about dismantling North Sydney's response, skittling them all out for 42 in less than 21 overs.

We finished the competition as Minor Premiers, with 10 wins, 1 loss and 1 tie. Finishing 1st on the ladder proved to be important as the last round game and the semi-final matches in all were washed out, without a ball being bowled, which meant that we went straight through to the Grand Final to face North Sydney Thomas.

The weather in the week of the Grand Final was no better than the prior 2 weeks – the rain continued to fall, leaving little time for pitches to dry out. The challenge for the NSCJA quickly became finding an oval that was playable and where a wicket could be prepared in time.

Gillespie Upper field at Knox School was allocated but it was only on the Saturday afternoon when a small contingent of McCabe players and parents went up to put the covers on the square that we realised that we had been allocated the smaller of the 2 pitches with boundaries of barely 30 metres!

Grand Final day arrived – it was dry, there had been a little rain overnight, but we knew that the surface would be OK because we had made sure the covers were down the day before. We won the toss and elected to bat – everything was going to plan, by the halfway mark in our innings we were 3-69. The top 4 batting group had done their job and given us a good platform to kick on from, which is exactly what our middle order batsman did with Mulder making a solid 40, and Constantian and Veitch making valuable contributions of 29 and 26 respectively. What we didn't realise at the time was how important our last 2 overs were, in the context of game, where Veitch and Constantian put on 37 runs, giving us what we thought was a strong and defendable total of 5-190.

North Sydney's response this time was much stronger – there was no batting collapse, and although they were behind the required run rate, they were 4-50 at the halfway mark in their innings. It got down to the last 6 overs, Edwards, their strike batsman was in, and finding the boundary with frightening regularity. Suddenly, with the short boundaries, chasing 10 an over was not such an impossible task. McCabe stuck to the task, they didn't panic, they kept putting the ball in good areas and maintain good discipline in the field, and it paid off, as we got to the last over where North Sydney needed 39 to win, ultimately falling 34 runs short with a score of 8-156, with Edwards finishing on 52 no., the wickets being shared across 7 of our bowlers. It was only now that the value of those 37 runs that we scored in the last 2 overs of our innings could be properly understood

Again, a great team effort and one that required contributions from the whole player group. Winning the Grand Final and being crowned Major Premiers, the 4th consecutive season for Mosman U17 age group, a feat that had never been done before. A special mention to Sarah Buchanan who did a phenomenal job as manager as well as all the parents who helped out during the season.

Season Report - U13 30 Over Div 1 Mosman Lyon

What another great season the boys had winning both the minor and major premierships. With Covid, rain and a rearranged rep season, it was a tricky season to manage, which saw us relying on younger siblings and subs from other teams in many weeks to make up the numbers.

Most of the boys have played together in one form or another for many years and we're very fortunate to have a well-balanced team with multiple bowling options and everyone contributing with the bat at various times throughout the year. However, most pleasing is the continued improvement in the boys fielding which remained a continued focus for us throughout the year. There were several catches and run outs during the year that wouldn't be out of place in the big bash highlights reel.

The impact of this skill was no better highlighted than the previous year's grand final rematch in round 3. After being bowled out for a sub-par 114, the boys were confronted with their first test of the year. They responded to the challenge and bowled the opposition out for 20 runs courtesy of three run outs, including 2 of their top 3 batsmen. What a difference great fielding can make.

The boys first hiccup in nearly 2 seasons came with the first game back after the Christmas break. Down on numbers, the boys suffered their first loss of the year. Defending just 89 runs the boys fought all the way to lose in the last over of the game. This loss refocused the boys as they headed towards the finals, remaining undefeated for the rest of the season and taking out the Minor Premiership.

A wash out in the first week of the finals saw the boys progress directly to the Grand Final. After winning the toss we chose to bat. With perhaps a few early nerves, we found ourselves in a little trouble at 3 for 26 in the 7th over. But as the boys had done all year, they didn't panic and the middle order set about consolidating and then accelerating. Whilst North Sydney slowed our run rate with good bowling at the death, we finished at a competitive 4 for 178 from our 30 overs.

North Sydney came out with great intent to chase down our score. After absorbing an early onslaught, we pulled back their run rate with good accurate bowling, enthusiastic fielding and regular wickets. As the game progressed the boys always had the game under control, but as we approached the final few overs, parents were starting to get anxious as North Sydney got closer to the target. With North Sydney still requiring 29 off the last three overs the boys held their nerve to close out the game for an 11-run victory.

Whilst it was great to chalk up another premiership, what is more pleasing is to see the spirit the boys play the game with. They are always supportive of each other and whilst they play with the intensity required to excel, are always respectful of the opposition and officials. It was a pleasure to coach such a lovely and respectful group of young men.

Finally, I would like to recognise and thank the parent group. They are both supportive and encouraging which helps create the environment for the boys to play their best. In particular a huge thanks to Erica and Russel Cox for assisting with coaching and to Gareth Newton for his fantastic management of the team.

Hoping we can back up again next year for the threeppeat.

U10 McCabe Premiers Report

I'd forgotten how much fun coaching U10s was after spending the last few seasons with the older age groups. This group simply loved their cricket and played that way each weekend. The U10 rules were pretty simple. You faced a certain number of balls, usually around 12 and the opposing team gained 4 runs for every dismissal. We played off 16 metres but had moved back to a hard ball. It only took a few games for the boys to get used the hard ball and we were away. Knowing this year that a trophy was up for grabs spurred the players and parents to new heights.

We had a big win first game (159 runs) then a couple of closer ones in rounds 2 and 3 but round 4 showed me how good this group was. We had a 241- run win against Lindfield playing some unbelievable cricket. I knew then we had a chance to go all the way.

We hit the top of the table joining another Lindfield team and remained that way until we faced each other in a top of the table clash in round 12. The boys were pumped and came out flying. We held our catches and ended up easy winners by 60 odd runs. The winning run continued and the excitement grew as the finals drew closer with two rounds to go.

The clouds then opened to the most torrential rain anyone had ever seen. It was quite unbelievable to see three weeks of rain every day. The last two rounds were washed out and then the Semi-final also washed out. This is where finishing top two is crucial as we progressed straight into the Grand Final. I love GF week as anything can happen. Injuries the biggest scare and thankfully we avoided those. My phone started to ring more than often than normal with some extra advice on batting orders and fielding positions. A couple of extra private lessons were thrown in and the nervous energy is there for all to see.
